## HAYCOCK TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE No. 6

An Ordinance of the Township of Haycock, Bucks County, Pennsylvania, regulating the opening of driveways into roads of the Township of Haycock, and providing penalties for violation.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Township Supervisors of the Township of Haycock, and it is hereby ordained and enacted by authority of the same that:

Section I. The following words, when used in this ordinance, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except in those instances where the context clearly indicates otherwise:

(a) The word "road" shall mean any public street, road, highway or other public place located in the Township of Haycock and maintained by the Board of Supervisors of Haycock Township and established for the use of vehicles.

(b) The word "person" shall mean and include any natural person, partnership, firm association or corporation.

In this ordinance the singular shall include the plural and the masculine shall include the feminine and the neuter.

Section II. It shall be unlaw-

ful for any person to open a driveway of any kind into any of the roads of the Township of Hayceck without first securing a permit therefor as herein after provided.

Section III. Any person who shall desire to open a driveway into any road of the Township of Haycock shall make application to the Secretary of the Board of Supervisors of Haycock Township in writing for the purpose. Such application shall set forth the name of the applicant and the exact location of the proposed driveway to be opened into a road of Haycock Township. Each application shall also be accompanied by an application fee of \$1.00.

Section IV. Any person violating or assisting in the violation in any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon summary conviction be sentenced to pay a fine of \$10.00, or in default thereof, he sentenced to imprisonment in the county jail for not more than thirty days.
